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DEFEATING DEPRESSION – BE PREPARED

The last 2 years have been a challenging time in my life. The responsibilities of leading a ministry, staff, students, budgets, family, and then going through a bad hospitalized covid experience, I am now aware that my self-care and mental health needs some time for restoration. God has blessed me by placing some powerful mentors in my Life! There is something special about men being real and trusting others to hear our struggles.

Last week I was sharing on not knowing how retirement was going to affect me in 4 years. One of my mentors was able to speak into my life, my marriage and share his experience and wisdom with his own retirement from ministry. I now know that when I feel the early signs of loneliness, I have a man I can go and share with!

While down in Abbotsford preparing for our AGM, I got to spend a couple of days praying to God over this area of my life. You see, I was a product of childhood depression and carried various traumas for 27 years and must remember that the affects will still be within me. It is important to continue to work on myself so I can be there for others who are starting out their own journey.

Psalm 23 Transition Society works everyday with men who are struggling with various levels of depression. Everyday I must be like a boy scout and be prepared for the stress that awaits me. I must look to God's word for help when it comes to dealing with the top four sources of stress in life: career, money, marriage/relationships, and parenting. One thing I know is that there is always a cause to the stress.

I have experienced being two types of people in the world... one going through my childhood to 27 years old drowning in despair and pain without hope, and then after my 2 suicide attempts, calling out to God, surrendering, and experiencing His rescue. Therefore, I can be so encouraged about the near future because I have experienced God's rescue. I know from experience that the Lord will hear the cries of all people and according to Psalm 40:2 will, "...lift them out of the pits of despair...out of the mud and mire and set their feet on the rock..." I would like to challenge anyone who has worked through depression to share that truth with a hopeless world and those struggling around them. Depression is a silent killer that takes too many lives...be a difference maker. Speak up and share your Hope!

Psalm 23 Transition Society is a place where people can come to find healing. It's a place where people can honestly admit their struggles and find rest from them. Remember Jesus said, "Come unto me all who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest." So, all Christians should take seriously Paul's injunction in 1 Thessalonians to "encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with all men."

For a depressed person during a depression spell, it can be hard to articulate to those around you what it is that you need. I've come up with a list that I think can help loved ones and care takers help someone who is going through a depressed spell:

1. Keep the house as quiet as possible--Loud music, tv shows, or voices cause agitation in the depressed person and want to make the person withdraw even more.

2. Allow the depressed person some extra sleep and rest, but don't let the person stay in bed constantly.

3. Give the depressed person a specific task to do and give them only one thing at a time. --Make a list or schedule of things the person needs to do, but do not give them the whole schedule, just one task at a time, and if the task is still overwhelming, help them with the task. The depressed person needs to do something, especially something that can be considered helpful or necessary.

4. Keep as much of a routine as possible. The depressed person will function better if there is predictability. Surprises are not good for someone who is depressed.

5. Give the gift of your time. Be ready to listen, but even if the person does not want to talk, just sitting and being with the person lets the person know that they really are not alone. God says, Trust in Me! You are never alone.

6. Use words of encouragement, not criticism. Do NOT tell the depressed person to "get over it." This is not helpful and can be harmful.

7. As soon as possible, the depressed person needs to do something for someone else. Anything that can get the person serving and less self-focused is good. The person needs help becoming outwardly focused.

But Christ will never reject us. And with Christ, we are never alone. In Christ we have the power to overcome our fears. And by Christ, we are commanded to reach out toward others.

Someone wise once told me that when I refuse to make my needs known, I deprive another person from being able to help meet my needs. I have learned over my years of healing that people are going to disappoint me, and I must learn to lower my expectations so I can achieve. Through my Spiritual growth, God will send people into my life to support, pray and encourage me, but only Jesus can meet my deepest needs, the voids of my abandonment issues and only Jesus can meet my every need. But still, I am called to reach out to others.

Ask yourself why you are where you are at this present moment. Most likely this is exactly where God wants you to be, even though it might hurt. God is ready to enable, strengthen, and call you to bear the burden and carry out His kingdom purposes. Let Him restore your soul. Jesus told us not to be anxious about tomorrow, worry cannot add to our lives. Each day has enough trouble of its own. It will come to pass. Hang in there and hold on to God. It takes 10 seconds of COURAGE to reach out and talk to someone...remember, you are not alone. This writing is very personal for myself as I have now been placed on a 6 month leave of absence to reduce my stress levels and I am grateful that the board of directors has hired a Program Manager to help take some of my daily tasks off my plate. Please pray that our Lord would recharge my batteries and provide me the rest needed.



As Psalm 23 enjoyed a strong year end giving campaign in 2021. We are very grateful for the continuing support that has kept the ministry out of the line of credit over the last 3 years!

In 2021, Psalm 23 took advantage of the government business loans and we did 2 of them through our bank. One was for \$40,000 and must pay back \$30,000 by this December 2022 and the other was for \$20,000 and must pay back \$10,000 by December.2022. In November 2021, Psalm 23 has placed our \$40,000 of loan payments into a 1-year term deposit and the loan will be fully paid in December 2022.

The largest Capital Project cost in 2021 was the Exterior Restoration of our facility. It was decided by the board of directors to take a \$50,000 loan out to cover the cost. This loan and the \$17,000 we had saved in 2020 covered the whole cost of the renovation and restoration.

We thank the donors who came along side to help raise the \$50,000 and it was paid off by the end of 2021, and the building looks fantastic.

Going into 2022, Psalm 23 was granted 2 grants for our 2022 Budget. Psalm 23 received a \$80,000 gaming grant to go towards salaries and utilities. The 2^{nd} grant was a \$17,500 food grant from Food Rescue.

Psalm 23 is also looking forward to hosting our fundraising events that have been on hold for the last 2 years. More info will be placed in our Praise Reports and on our Facebook page.

The Board of Directors would like to clearly communicate our 2022 financial picture so there is opportunity to pray about the needs of our budget giving.

Our prayer request is that God would provide financially between now and December 31, which would allow Psalm 23 to not only meet this year's program budget needs, but also our project grants towards our Training Programs.


