# Breaking Free from Controlling Habits

Since the beginning of the year, I have started to see the patterns of old controlling habits coming back in some students and in a couple of Psalm 23 alumni. We get to see and experience various positive patterns and habits get developed, but we also see old habits take strongholds.

I have worked with many people since 2001, both individuals and families. Motivation and setbacks can break down to the willingness of three kinds of people. There are **spectators**, anticipators, and participators.

The **spectator** is just there to observe; the **anticipator** is expecting real blessings but not doing anything about it; and the **participator** is busy getting honest, praying, volunteering, planning, and doing the deep-rooted work. The **participators** are the minority, the sacred few who are doing "more than others."

When talking about breaking free from habits, most people's thoughts immediately switch to...well this will be a good one for the drug addict and the alcoholics, they need a message like this. While I agree, 2 Peter 2:19 goes so much further than that...every person has the need to break free from something in their life. Peter says, "For a man is a slave to whatever has mastered him." (NIV). We will never know the freedom of being in God's presence as long as we remain enslaved.

Some people are a slave to work, some people are slave to jealousy, some people are slave to gossip, and many are slave to anger, pornography, various other addictions, and vices that hold us in bondage. So, lets take an inventory of the controlling NEGITIVE HABITS we allow in our lives, that needs to be broken

**#1.** *HOW DO WE IDENTIFY A CONTROLLING HABIT*---Do you do something you wish you wouldn't do? Do you find yourself continuing to do it anyway, even though you have tried to stop or change it? A controlling habit is something you find yourself doing even though it is destructive ether physically, mentally, emotionally, relationally, or spiritually. Romans 7:15 For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. (ESV)

You must understand many good people are bound by bad controlling habits. Some of us, reason in our minds, if we admit we have a habit than we are less than spiritual. Using denial and defense mechanisms is not the way to deal with the problem.

Be honest, look at your life and like Paul, evaluate the things you find yourself doing that you hate. Realize the importance of the identification process and then submit your own inabilities to make the necessary changes. I encourage you to take a moment sometime today, tonight or this week and write down the habits in your life that you want to see absolute victory in.

In the addiction process we have come to know that our greatest spiritual challenges came from; *abandonment issues, materialism, pride, self-centeredness, laziness, anger, bitterness, sexual lust, envy, gluttony and lying*. Those we counsel at Psalm 23 noted that temptations seemed more potent when they neglected their time with God and when they experience being tired physically. We are also vulnerable during these times. We can become self-confident, instead of God confident. We need to be aware that we are also vulnerable to overconfidence when we experience a spiritual victory. The Sin of Pride is an absolute killer among many good people, God sees our secret sins and vices.

**#2.** WHY ARE CONTROLLING HABITS SO POWERFUL?--- They slowly bind you. Life controlling habits are formed at a pace almost unnoticeable. Usually, a person doesn't even know they have formed a habit in their life. And if someone asks, they say, "I can quit at any time. This isn't a problem." When we use denial and defense mechanisms, we know that we are in trouble. Habits are like a cable. Each day we do something in a pattern, we intertwine one thread with another. As the threads are woven together a cable is formed. On any day, the threads we added were too small to be noticed. But, after many threads have been woven in, we find that together they have become an unbreakable cable. So it is with habits, daily practices over time become habits that seem unbreakable. For example, the person who smokes isn't addicted on the first pack of cigarettes. It takes time after time smoke after smoke before the body becomes dependent upon nicotine.

Habits are formed through willful behavior A person has given in so many times to this belief, that they are now addicted. This is one of the reasons why it is so important to get to your root causes to start the healing process. This is the reason a habit is so powerful because it is so subtle. Awareness and Acceptance can provide the foundation to having the willingness to change the behavioural habit. Once a habit has broken your will to fight, you feel a sense of hopelessness. Habits destroy you in many ways: Physically, spiritually, emotionally, and relationally.

#3. NEW HABITS TO REPLACE THE BAD ONES--- Bad controlling habits must be replaced by good ones. Find support from others, it is essential for your recovery or healing. We start our healing process by admitting our faults to one another. You may question, why do I need to drag another person into this? Why can't I just admit it to God? Why don't I just pray about it, make a list, talk to God about it? But why do I need to tell another person? Admit you have a problem. Everything starts with confession. Accepting the responsibility that you have a problem. They say in the Twelve Steps program, that you cannot win until you know you have a problem. 1Jn.1:9 "If we confess our sin, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." I believe true healing starts with confession. Many people give in to a state of denial, they never admit they have a problem therefore they never break free. The first step is recognizing you are bound, and you have a problem that is the first step in breaking free.

We all have experienced, rejection, fear, hurt and distrust, so we need to get to admitting (not blaming) that our root cause is the abandonment we have experienced, the root of our problem is relational. It is not about blaming parents or care givers, but to understand everyone who walks this earth has experienced abandonment, yes, even Jesus. We lie to each other. We deceive each other. We're dishonest with each other. We wear masks. We pretend we have it together. But we don't. and we deny our true feelings, and we play games. As a result, we end up living with shame and it makes us insecure. We start to believe that If someone really knows the truth about me, they wouldn't love me. God says revealing your feelings is the beginning of healing. The amazing thing is, when you risk honesty with someone, all a sudden, this feeling of freedom comes into your life. You realize that everybody has habits and often they have the same one you do. James. 5:16 "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective."

Take one day at a time. Matt. 6:11 "Give us this day our daily bread." Why? Because God wants to give you enough strength to change for one day, one situation, not for the week, one month, the rest of your life. He wants to take it one day at a time, so you trust in Him.

That's like the old saying, "How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time." You take a life problem (you did not get the habit over night) and you break it down into bite size pieces and you work on it one day at a time and you get God's strength one Day at a time.

Any victory, no matter how minor you may think it is, thank God for it, and you take one defeat at a time, and you get victory one day at a time. Phil 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me"
